An alumna of New Dramatists and member of Ensemble Studio Theatre, Hutton is a three-time winner of the Samuel French Short Play Festival, nine-time finalist for the Heideman Award, Francesca Primus Prize finalist, and recipient of an EST/Sloan Commission and a NYFA Fellowship. She is a three-time MacDowell Fellow. Hutton's works have been presented in London at the Orange Tree Theatre, the Tabbard, New End, and Wanstead Theatre, and six times at the Edinburgh Fringe.
